We are pleased to let you know that all of Giles County Public Schools will be implementing the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) for school year 2023-2024. CEP allows eligible schools participating in the USDA National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program to provide meals at no cost to all students without meal applications.

What does this mean for you and your student(s) attending Giles County Public Schools?

Great news! All students attending any Giles County Public School(s) are eligible to receive one complete nutritious breakfast and lunch at school at **no charge** to your household each school day. In order to receive the breakfast and / or lunch at no charge the student will have to take a complete meal as per the USDA National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program. Students who pack their lunch and /or who wish to get a milk will be charged the standard price for milk. Students that wish to purchase extra items (À la carte) will be charged the set price per item. *There will be no charging allowed of individual food items*.

You do not have to take any action. The student(s) in your household who attend a participating CEP school(s) will receive a complete breakfast and lunch meal at no cost without you paying a fee or submitting a meal application.
